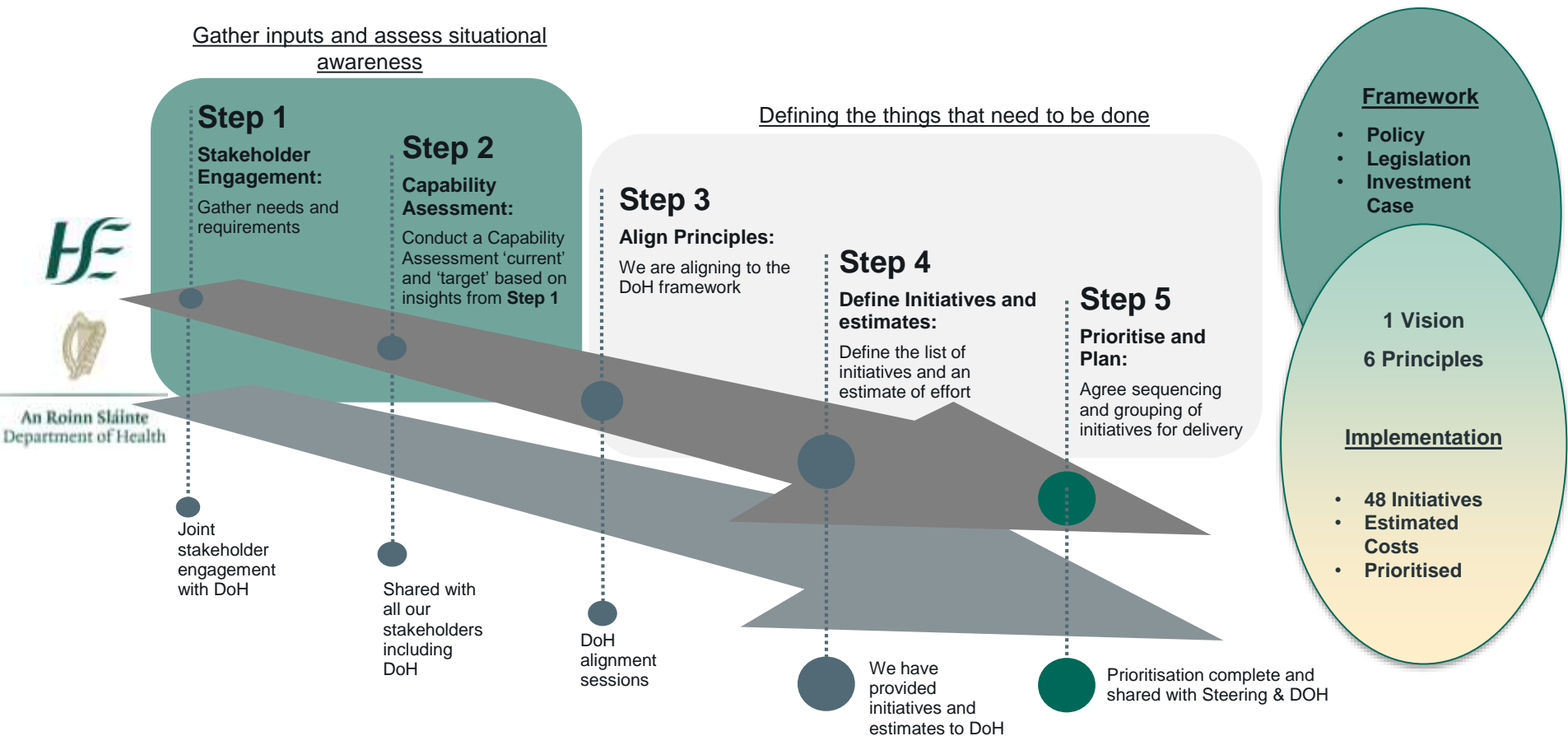


Our Collective Ambition

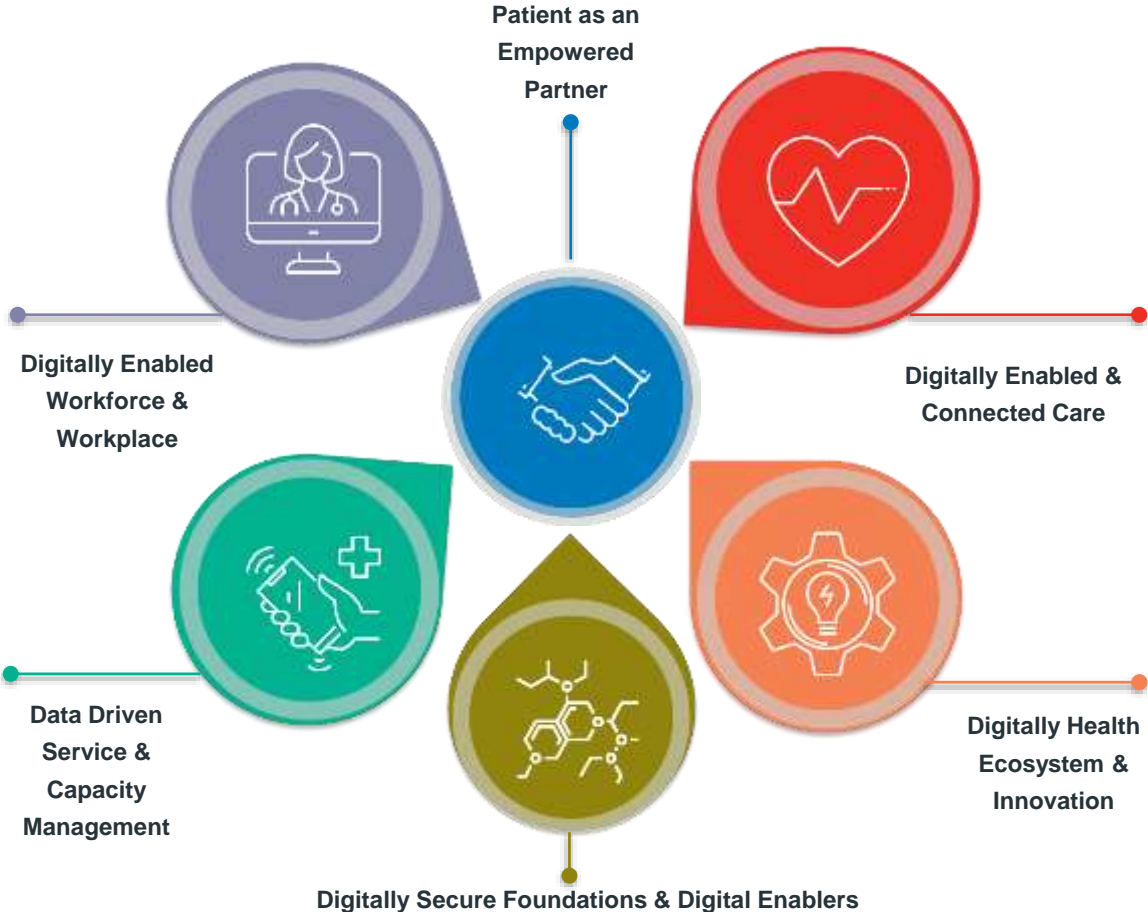
- The **eHealth Strategy** is 10 years old (2013), and the **Knowledge and Information Plan** is 8 years old (2015)

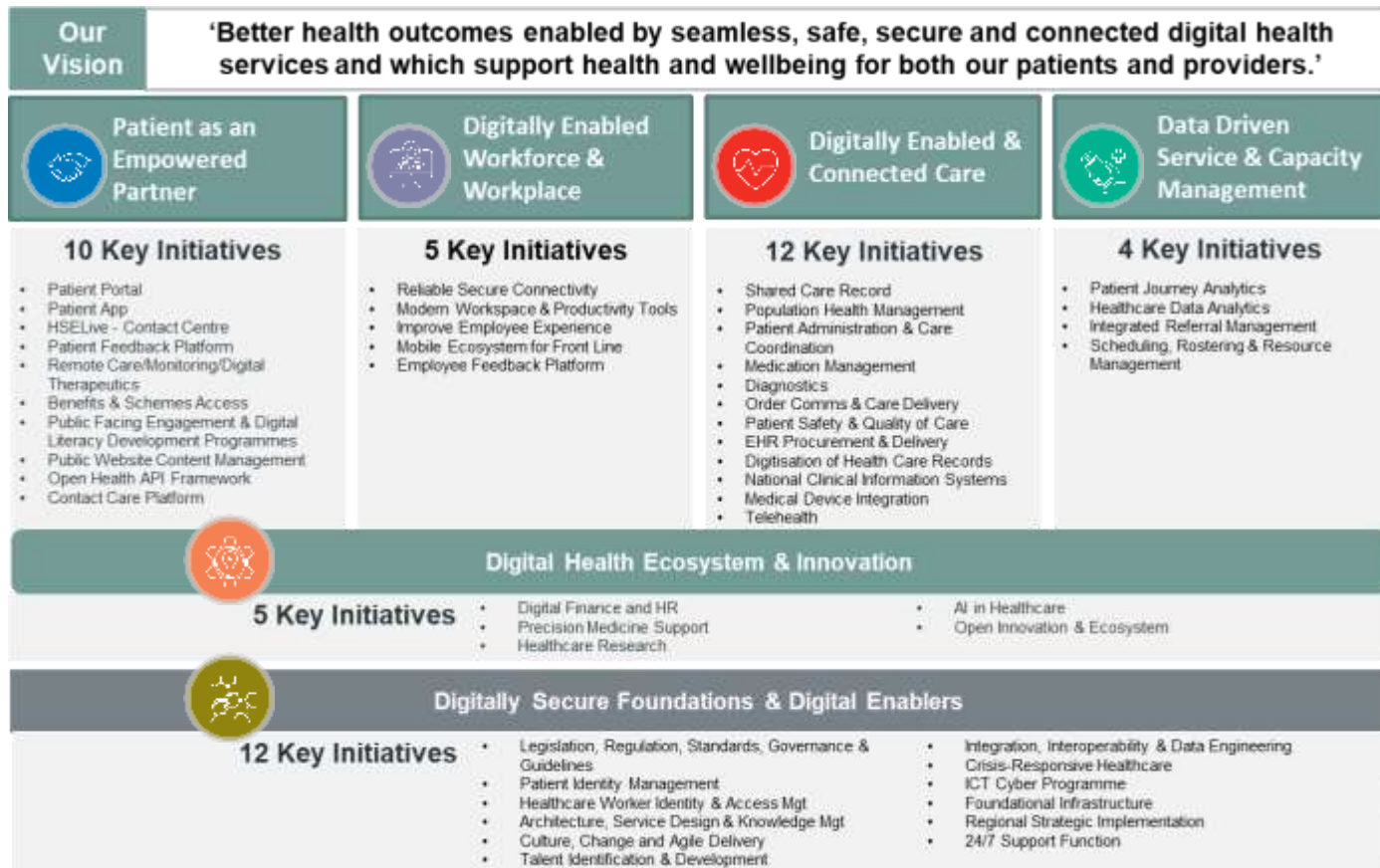

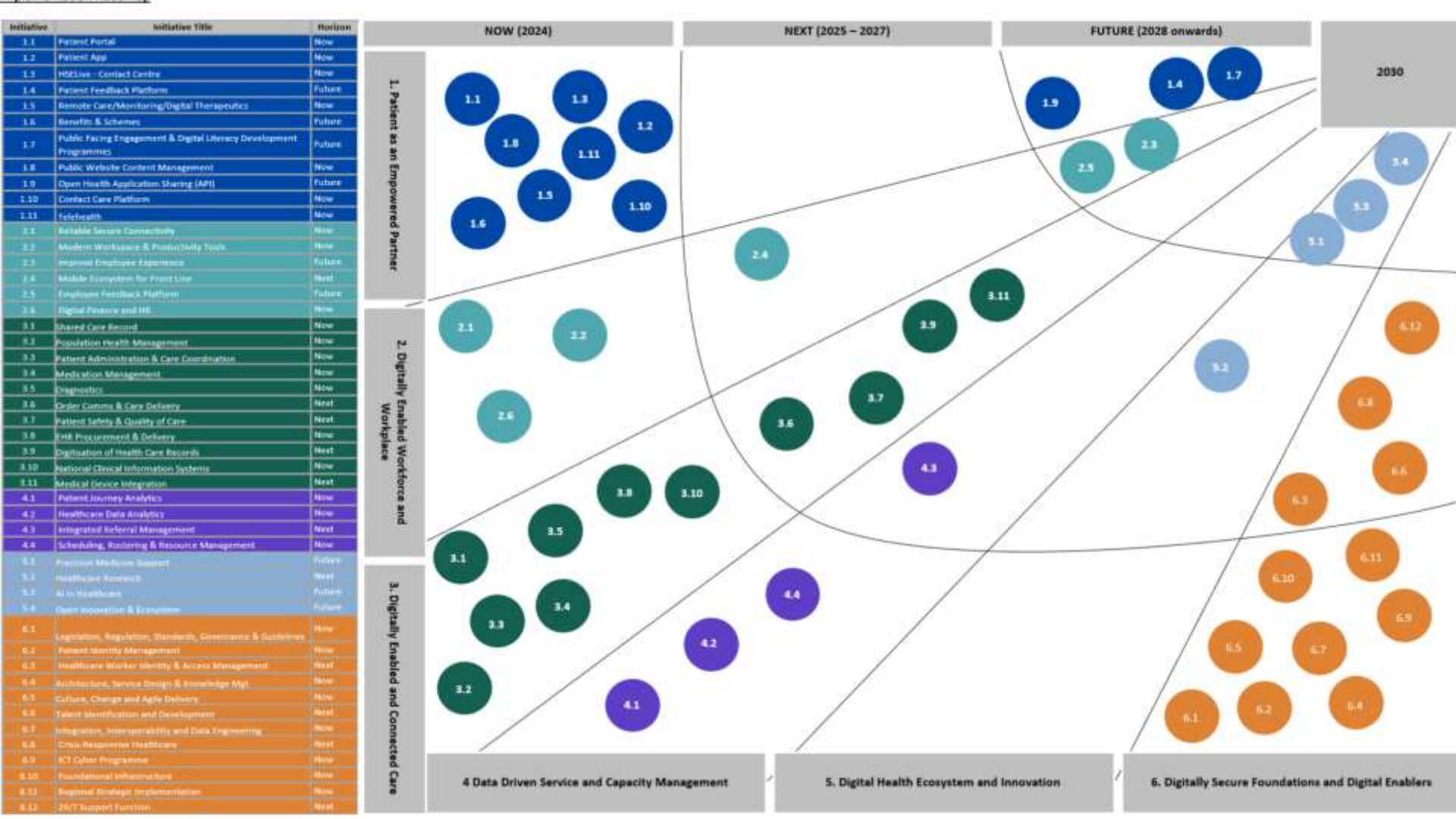

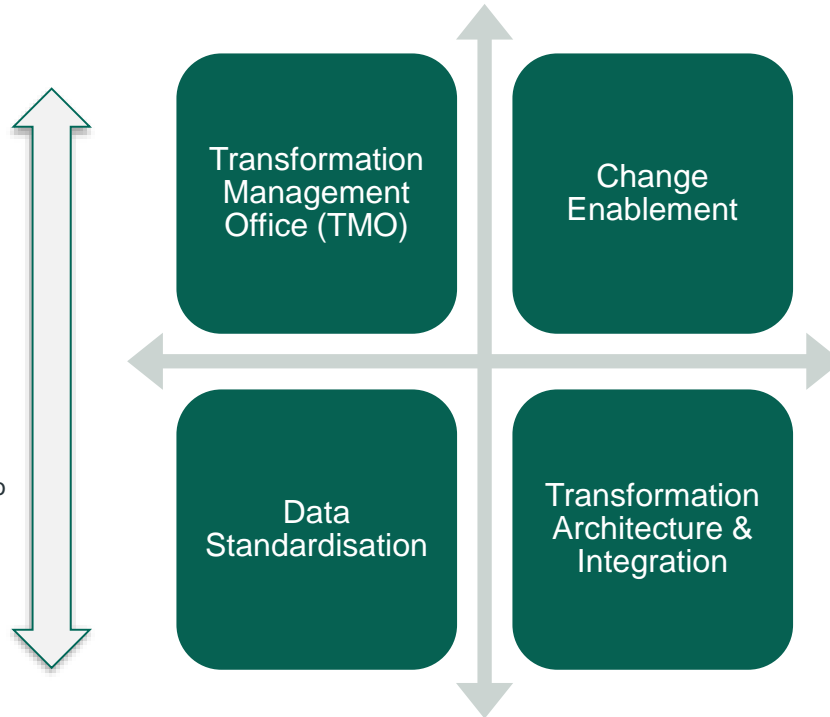
Mobilisation Stage

- **2024 Service Planning**

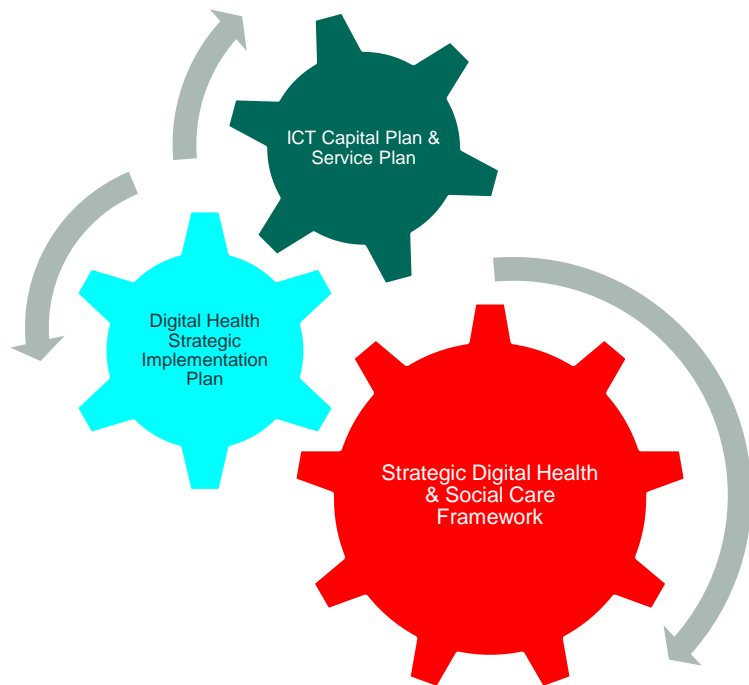
Service planning and ICT Capital planning for 2024 has been aligned to the new (draft) framework and strategy



The Mobilisation Phase for the Programme team consists of:

- Commencing the process of aligning and engaging the broader Health Service in this transformation journey, including existing eHealth Programmes and existing Service Priorities.
- Syncing with Health Regions and HSE Centre design activities

Aligning the vision to our service planning process...



- The Department's **Strategic Digital Health & Social Care Framework** sets out the vision, goals/objectives, policy direction for Digital Health for the remainder of this decade.
- The HSE's **Digital Health Strategic Implementation Plan** builds upon and aligns with the Department's **Strategic Digital Health & Social Care Framework** with its primary purpose being to set out the digital health initiatives which will deliver the vision and mission set out in the Department's Framework.
- The collective ambition in these two documents are multi year in nature, and while they have not been published yet they are being used on Service Planning and the development of the **ICT Capital Plan and Service Plan for 2024**



Proposed Capital Investment (%) by Principle

- We have developed our proposed ICT Capital plan in line with the six principles
- The portfolio view is illustrated in the accompanying table
- ICT Capital is supporting 28 of 48 initiatives in 2024
- Across all funding streams, 40 of 48 initiatives are being funded in 2024

Principle	Percent Total
1. Patient as an Empowered Partner	3.4%
2. Digitally Enabled Workforce and Workplace	10.3%
3. Digitally Enabled and Connected Care	42.6%
4. Data Driven Service and Capacity Management	5.0%
5. Digital Health Ecosystem and Innovation	1.0%
6. Digitally Secure Foundations and Digital Enablers	37.7%
Grand Total	100.00%

Conclusion

- The last decade has seen significant technological progress, necessitating an updated strategy to integrate new digital health tools and platforms.
- The **COVID-19** pandemic highlighted the need for robust digital health infrastructure to manage public health crises effectively.
- Patients now expect more digital engagement options in their healthcare journey, such as telemedicine, online appointments, and digital consultations.
- Through our extensive stakeholder engagement there is strong consensus that our **1 Vision, 6 Principles, and 48 Initiatives** not only ambitiously capture but also positively address the feedback we've received.
- Collectively, with the Department of Health we look forward to publishing these documents which provide us with a solid foundation for engagement with Government and other key stakeholders to gain support to deliver on our ambition
