

SNOMED CT International Expo

Members of the Irish SNOMED CT National Release Centre attended the SNOMED CT International Expo in September 2022. The SNOMED CT Expo united clinical terminology SMEs from around the world, including government officials, health IT professionals, health practitioners, researchers, academics and vendors.

This year the Expo presentations fell under four program streams:

- Advances in Research and Innovation; showcased innovation of SNOMED CT to accelerate data, information, evidence and knowledge creation, supporting a wide range of informatics research.
- Demonstrating Implementation Excellence; explored practical demonstrations **SNOMED** CT. Implementers from healthcare organisations, government agencies and industry will share their lessons learned, outcomes and benefit realisation achievements.
- Enhancing Clinical Practice and Outcomes; focused on the application of SNOMED CT in clinical settings and clinical research; aimed at enhancing the patient

or citizen experience, clinical outcomes, reducing costs or improving efficiency. This may include such areas as precision medicine, data analytics, decision support, clinical guidelines etc.

 Terminology Leading Practices; covered experience and ideas on innovative enhancements of SNOMED CT, as well as those in conjunction with other international standards, e.g., content development, mappings, description logic, reference sets and more.

Some other highlights of the Expo were key note speakers discussing the progress, challenges and opportunities brought about with the G7 Standards and Interoperability position, the mandate of the Global Digital Health Partnership (GDHP) and the global adoption of the

International Patient Summary.

Another highlight lecture was on this year's James Read Memorial Lecture. Dr. Gong Mengchun represents the Institute of Health Management, Southern Medical University, China and he shared the use of SNOMED CT in the effective surveillance and control of COVID-19 through the Honghu Hybrid System; a project initiated in response to the emerging need for an innovative surveillance system.


Through the vast examples of presentations of SNOMED CT at the expo from different parts of the globe, it was evident of the essential role SNOMED CT has in standardising the clinical information, triggering decision support tools and enabling multi-national and large-scale real world studies.





SMART Health Summit

The 2022 Smart Health Summit took place on Wednesday 28th September, in Croke Park, Dublin. The event focused on digital healthcare solutions and how they can be practically implemented in the workplace, along with how technology and data insights can be used in improving care, access and user experience in the aftermath of Covid-19.

The unpredictable nature of the pandemic highlighted the crucial role of technology in delivering virtual care. The 2022 Smart Health Summit showcased presentations and discussions on the digital tools used by a variety of organisations in innovating service design, supporting integration, improving population health management and reducing health inequalities.

When discussing the key enablers needed to drive improvements in eHealth, the panel said that getting the basics in place is key in the adoption of digital tools in the workplace. These tools can then be effectively implemented by solving the problems of the frontline staff, with as minimal effort and investment of time from them as possible.

Lorraine Smyth of Change and Innovation Acute Strategy in the HSE, spoke of elective care backlogs and a targeted patient's central booking system with a waitlist protocol to standardise processes in treating the right patients, in the right order, fast. Lorraine also talked about a health performance visualisation platform, which is a project at the moment that she hopes will be adopted nationwide, following a series of trials in the hospitals.

Going forward, digital will play a pivotal role in the design, delivery and innovation of health and care. As a result of the pandemic, healthcare systems around the world will continue to invest in and reimagine healthcare to ensure that digital health technologies are improved and adapted to emerging regulations and ever-changing patient demand.

The 2022 SMART Health Summit exhibited that through the increased use of digital products in the sector, the health of our citizens and our society will be as strong as possible.




